Is a prepaid cell phone provider entitled to a common law refund of statutory 911 fees paid to the CMRS Board when: (1) the provider questioned the statute's applicability to prepaid cellular services from the time it began offering those services in Kentucky; (2) the CMRS Board informed the provider that the 911-fee statute did apply to prepaid cellular services; (3) the provider paid 911 fees for two years, rather than filing a lawsuit to obtain a ruling regarding the statute's applicability; (4) this Court held that the statute did not apply to prepaid cellular providers in *Virgin Mobile*, 448 S.W.3d 241 (Ky. 2014); and (5) the provider promptly requested a refund from the CMRS Board and properly paid 911 fees after the General Assembly amended the statute?
